PARENT / TEACHER INTERVIEWS

WEST PARKWAY

I would like to remind parents that the school side of West Parkway is designated as a drop off and pick up zone. The signs on the road indicate this. It is not for parking and leaving your car to bring children into school or collect them after school. Please be aware the local council have and will continue to issue fines for those not following the rules.

ACCESS TO THE SCHOOL

At CLG, compared to many schools with perimeter fences, we are very open. After reviewing the current entry and exit points, I have decided to lock the gates restricting access to the two school driveways: 1) off of the eastern side of Windsor Avenue and 2) off of West Parkway. There will be times when contractors and other vehicles will be permitted access under supervision. Usually this will not be at the peak drop of and pick up times.

HAVE YOU UPDATED YOUR SENTRAL FOR PARENTS APP?







Thank you to all parents for your patience regarding our Sentral Parent Portal and app. The app has now been updated and improved. Please delete the app off your phone or iPad and reinstall it. If you were using a shortcut on your phone to the web version please delete this also and install the app. We have tested the new app with a few parents and it is working better.

To clarify the main purpose of the app is to allow notifications to be sent to parents when we post a new message. It also provides a shortcut to enable parents to access the portal easily. Messages are displayed on the main app but that is all the app provides. Once in the app, click the menu in the top left hand corner to access the portal and functions such as downloading newsletters, advising the school on absences and viewing the staff calendar.

You will notice that the login to the app has changed slightly and you now need to add the name of the school.

Please be reminded that all, whole school based parent communication, including the newsletters, will be sent out via the Parent Portal and it is important that all parents login. Please see either Penny or Megan in the office if you are experiencing difficulties, we can reset parent passwords and support with troubleshooting.









Using the force!


