COLOUR EXPLOSION

The Colonel Light Gardens Primary School inaugural Colour Run was held a couple of weeks ago on an overcast Thursday afternoon. It was wonderful to see the joy on the faces of the children participating and joining in the fun of moving around the school oval, under nets, over mats, over hurdles, through the pole maze, through the sprinkler tent and then through the colour station. Last Friday at our whole school assembly I announced (with the appropriate theatrics) that we raised **\$27,896.45**. What an amazing effort from our wonderfully generous school community. I would like to thank our hard working Fundraising Committee for all their support and encouragement leading up to, during and after the event.

The main reason for holding the Colour Run was to raise money to contribute to the building cost of our Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA) which is beginning in the school holidays. We set an ambitious goal of **\$15,000**. After costs and prizes are taken out of the total amount committed, we'll easily achieve this goal. These funds will pay for all the audio visual items we are adding to the COLA which were not in the original budget.

Thank you again for the support of the school community. I have had some students ask me if we can do the colour part every term! I am sure it will happen again in a year or two.

Where do our year 7 students go?

I had a parent recently email me asking for some information regarding where the majority of our year 7s enrol in high school. I indicated due to confidentiality reasons, I couldn't name schools, however I could provide some statistics which may be of interest.

In 2019 going into 2020

- 18% of our year 7 students will attend non-government secondary schools
- 11.5% will attend their zoned government school
- 70.5% will attend an out of zone government secondary school
- 21% of these out of zone placements were accepted into a specialist secondary school



It works like this:




Condensation will drop in hole and will go in to condensation tub will you empty at bottom, with left over condensation to water plants (our class radish for example) so plants can grow health.

YEAR 5 - 7 BYOD RECOMMENDATIONS

Next year our bring your own device program (BYOD) will be extended to year 5 students. The key reasons underpinning this decision are:

- Year 7's will be transitioning to high school in 2022, meaning students would only have one year of the BYOD program
- The BYOD program supports the iPad program that continues at Unley high school in years 8-10
- Most BYOD programs offered by government schools in SA are offered for years 5-7
- iPads are a personal device, allowing the students to efficiently access their work. It takes more time to access files on shared devices
- The delivery of a cross-curriculum inquiry program would be enhanced with 1:1 use of iPads.
- The program has been successful in Year 6 and 7.
- Students in year 5 work more independently and often need their own device. Students are currently limited to sharing iPads, one between two, which presents challenges for teaching and learning.

Many parents have been inquiring about what specifications of device to buy. For ease of access we have saved this information to the website so that it is accessible for new and future parents. We have also included a helpful fact sheet to help set up your child's device for the first time. Please read it carefully and follow the instructions to keep your child safe outside of school hours.

ICC T20 WORLD CUP 2020 SCHOOL PROGRAM OPPORTUNITY
