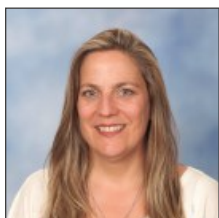
### RACHEL PALMER

## FINANCE NEWS

### 2020 MATERIALS & SERVICES FEE - POLL RESULTS

Thank you to the parents who responded to the 2020 Materials & Services Charge poll. The result was overwhelmingly in favour of setting the prescribed sum for 2020 at \$400 – 163 votes in favour and 22 votes against. The charge has **not** been increased for the 2020 school year.

Families will be invoiced for this charge when school returns in 2020.

A reminder that the payment terms are 30 days. This means that parents must have paid in full **OR** submitted an instalment agreement **OR** applied for School Card within a month of receiving the invoice.

The preferred instalment plan is by Direct Debit (10 fortnightly payments of \$40.00 per student **OR** \$47.50 if you choose to include the \$75.00 excursion levy).

Families eligible to apply for the School Card Scheme will need to submit an application for the 2020 school year. **REMEMBER:** The school card scheme must be applied for annually, previously approved applications **do not** roll over into the following year.

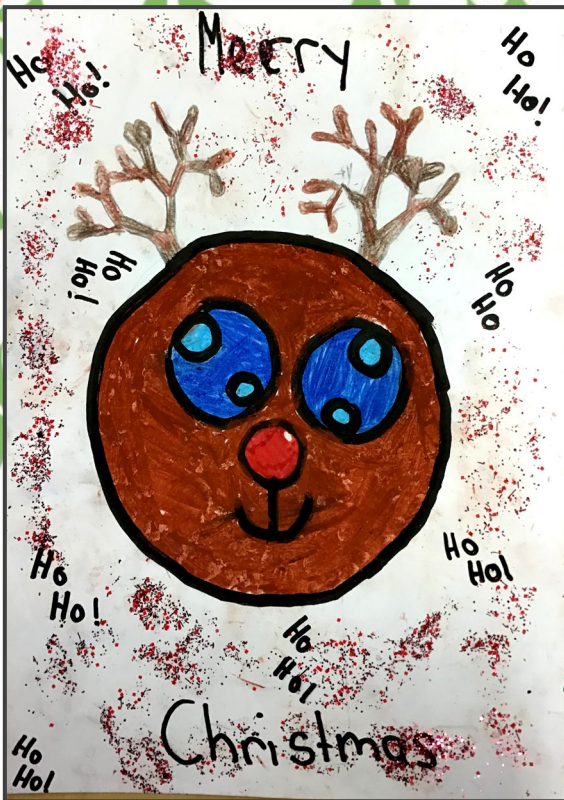

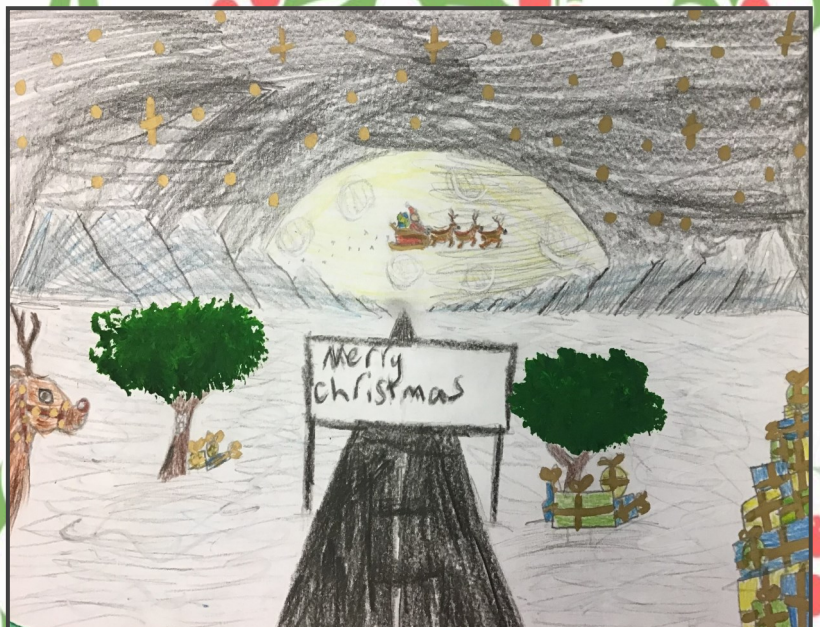
