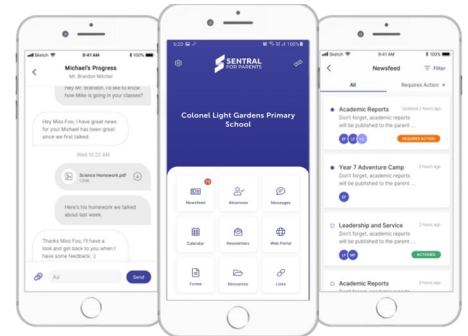

SEMESTER 1 REPORTS ARE NOW DIGITAL

Our semester 1 written reports will be pushed out digitally today (Friday, 25 June). As has been communicated all year, we are no longer providing printed copies of reports. You will be able to access them through the **SENTRAL for parents app / portal** as a PDF copy which you can then download and save for future reference. Hopefully you are prepared for this. For this semester only, as we transition from paper to PDF copies, we can email a PDF copy of your child's report to you if you can not access reports in SENTRAL due to not having an internet service, please contact Adele in front office. (***N.B. this consideration does not apply to parents who have not yet registered a SENTRAL for Parents account***).

Teachers put an enormous amount of work and thought into the grades and comments they provide using evidence and professional judgement. We hope that parents and carers will look carefully at all three aspects of the report, which when read together should give you a thorough understanding of how your child is doing, and where they can further improve:

ACHIEVEMENT LEVELS: The grades are decided through evidence by assessing student learning against the achievement standards outlined in the Australian Curriculum. A '**Satisfactory**' rating, equates to a '**C**', and is given to a student who is currently achieving or is on track this year to achieve the year level standard. To receive an 'Excellent' rating is something very superior. An 'Excellent' student achievement rating not only shows an advanced understanding of the knowledge, skills and understandings of the subject but indicates he or she can apply them in new and unfamiliar contexts. The Australian Curriculum achievement standards can be accessed at

EFFORT RATING: It is important to look at this in relation to the achievement level. All we can ask is for every student to do their best. This rating will give an indication of how much room for improvement the teacher believes exists.

COMMENTS: Explanatory comments focus on areas of strength and goals for further improvement in English and Maths in some detail. The general comment can refer to social or work skills or to other areas of the curriculum. In this section, teachers often highlight a focus area for the remainder of the year.

After reading the report, please contact your child's class teacher if you have any additional questions.

THE PERENNIAL PROBLEM OF PARKING (PPP)

I have had multiple parents contact me again about cars breaching the rules and expectations around school parking especially in the kiss and drop zone in the school lane way. From what has been reported, there seems to be an increasing number of cars parking in the no parking zone (between 8:15am - 9:15am), especially at around 8:40am - 8:50am, when some parents are parking and walking their child/ren into the school grounds.

I would again ask for everyone to follow the signs and be respectful of others trying to use the kiss and drop zone appropriately. Do not be surprised if you receive a fine if you park incorrectly as I know the council patrol these areas regularly.

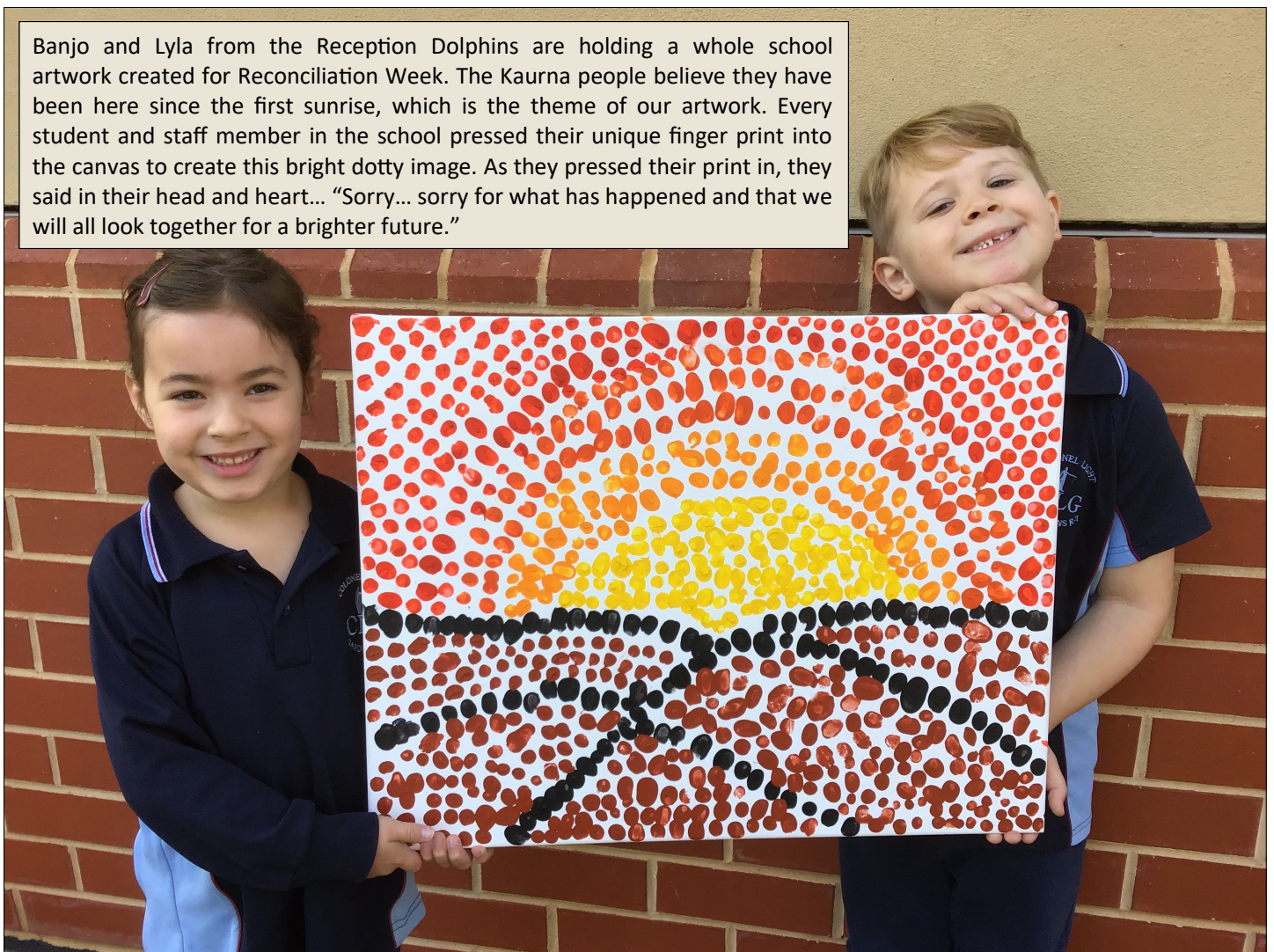

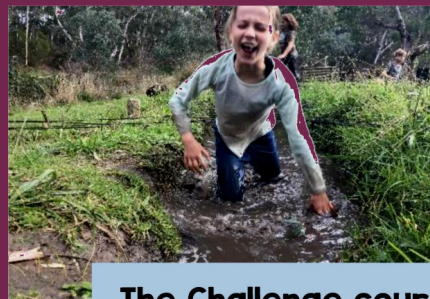

FINANCE NEWS

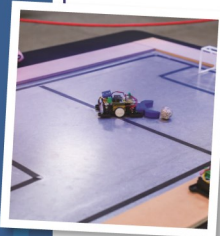
